















We have 2 main project goals for 2014. One is a short-term goal, and the other is more long-term. Let us tell you a little about each one.

The short-term goal for 2014 is to obtain property in Freedom Park and build a **church building for Hope Church!** With \$15,000, we can build 1.5 tabernacles to give us a place for both adults and children to worship. Additional money that comes in for this project will be used to furnish a



kitchen and build a small home for a caretaker to live next to the church building. The buildings will not only be used for services on weekends, but also as an after school drop-in center where kids can get help with homework, learn important life skills, and eat a meal each day.

You may recognize our long-term project from last year. It's a big goal, and we know that it will take some time to reach it. We are confident that God is calling us to set down roots in South Africa. The goal is to raise \$300,000 to fund phase 1 of Engage Africa's **Hope Ministry Center** in South Africa.

Phase 1 includes: register Engage Africa as a legal non-profit organization in South Africa giving us the ability to own property (accomplished in 2013), purchase property, establish infrastructure for water and electricity, build a baby shelter, 2-4 foster homes, and staff homes.
